

Winter Storm Watch Issued for Parts of Central Ohio

Good Evening,

We wanted to take a moment to let everyone know we are keeping a close eye on the development of possible inclement weather later this week. The National Weather Service has issued a Winter Storm Watch for parts of central Ohio due to a potential winter storm moving into the area later this week. The watch is in effect starting Wednesday, February 2 for the following counties: Delaware County, Franklin County, Licking County and Madison County.

A heavy amount of mixed precipitation is possible, with some areas experiencing more ice and freezing rain and others experiencing more significant snowfall amounts Wednesday evening through Friday morning.

Safety is our top priority. As a reminder, in the event Franklin County issues a Level 2 or Level 3 snow emergency, we will close the academy. If we are experiencing heavy snow and or freezing rain and remain on a Level 1 snow emergency, we may issue a 2-hour delay. Similarly, if inclement weather develops during the day and Franklin County issues a Level 1 snow emergency during normal business hours, we may ask that you pick up your child at your earliest convenience or close the academy early.

In the event of an academy closure or delay, we will notify you via email and text message through Tadpoles by 5:30 AM.
